ADMISSION OF NEW UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS IN STATE HIGHER  
EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS

THE MINISTER OF EDUCATION AND CULTURE OF THE REPUBLIC OF  
INDONESIA,

Considering : that in order to implement the provisions of Article 73 paragraph (7) of Law Number 12 of 2012 concerning Higher Education, it is necessary to stipulate a Regulation of the Minister of Education and Culture on Admission of New Undergraduate Students in State Higher Education Institutions;

In view of : 1. Article 17 paragraph (3) of the 1945 Constitution of the Republic of Indonesia;  
2. Law Number 39 of 2008 on State Ministries (State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia of 2008 Number 166, Supplement to the State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia Number 4916);  
3. Law Number 12 of 2012 on Higher Education (State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia of 2012 Number 158, Supplement to the State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia Number 5336);

4. Government Regulation Number 4 of 2014 on the Implementation of Higher Education and Management of Higher Education (State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia of 2014 Number 16, Supplement to the State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia Number 5500);
5. President Regulation Number 82 of 2019 on the Ministry of Education and Culture (State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia of 2019 Number 242);
6. Regulation of the Minister of Education and Culture Number 45 of 2019 on Organization and Work Procedure of the Ministry of Education and Culture (State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia of 2019 Number 1673);

HAS DECIDED:

To enact: REGULATION OF THE MINISTER OF EDUCATION AND CULTURE ON  
ADMISSION OF NEW BACHELOR STUDENTS IN STATE HIGHER EDUCATION  
INSTITUTIONS.

## CHAPTER I

### GENERAL PROVISIONS

#### Article 1

In this Ministerial Regulation, what is meant by:

1. State Higher Education Institutions (Perguruan Tinggi Negeri), hereinafter abbreviated as PTN, are universities established and/or administered by the Government.
2. Undergraduate Program is academic education intended for graduates of secondary education or the equivalent so that they are able to practice science and technology through scientific reasoning.
3. Study Program is a unit of education and learning activities that have a curriculum and method certain learning in one type of academic, professional, and/or vocational education.

4. Capacity is the number of the Study Program to accommodate the number of students for the educational process based on the availability of human resources, learning infrastructure, and/or laboratories at PTN in accordance with the provisions of the legislation.
5. Computer-Based Writing Exam (Ujian Tulis Berbasis Komputer), hereinafter abbreviated as UTBK, is a written test conducted using computer facilities.
6. Rector is the head of higher education at universities and institutes.
7. Ministry is a ministry that carries out government affairs in the field of education.
8. Minister is the minister who carries out government affairs in the field of education.

## CHAPTER II

### PRINCIPLES AND ROUTES FOR ADMISSION OF NEW STUDENTS

#### Article 2

Acceptance of new bachelor students at PTN is carried out with the following principles:

- a. fair, which is no discrimination against religion, ethnicity, race, gender, age, social position, physical condition, and student's level of economic ability, by counting on the potential and academic achievements of prospective students and the specificity of the Study Program at the relevant PTN;
- b. accountable, which is carried out in accordance with clear procedures and criteria;
- c. flexible, which is held several times and each prospective student can take a maximum of 2 (two) times of UTBK;
- d. efficient, which is administering PTN entrance tests using information and communication technology, involving human resources, and time flexibility; and

- e. transparent, which is the implementation of new student admissions in PTN is conducted openly and the results of the implementation are easily accessed.

### Article 3

- (1) The admission path for new undergraduate students at PTN is carried out through:
  - a. the national selection of state higher education institutions (SNMPTN) is carried out based on the results of the straightening of academic performance, non-academic achievements, and/or portfolios of prospective students;
  - b. joint selection of state higher education institutions (SBMPTN) is carried out based on the results of the UTBK and can be added with other criteria in accordance with the special talents determined by the relevant PTN; and
  - c. other selection.
- (2) The straightening of academic, non-academic achievements, and/or portfolios of prospective students as referred to in paragraph (1) letter a is a selection of:
  - a. the report card scores of students on secondary education or the equivalent originating from all schools throughout Indonesia; and/or
  - b. non-academic achievements of secondary education students or the equivalent.
- (3) UTBK as referred to paragraph (1) letter b consists of:
  - a. the scholastic potential test, which is a test that aims to measure the cognitive abilities needed for prospective students who are predicted to be able to complete their studies in higher education; and
  - b. academic competency test, which is a test that aims to assess other competencies.
- (4) Other selections as referred to in paragraph (1) letter c are carried out based on the selection and procedures determined by each Higher Education Leader.

Article 4

- (1) The implementation of the SNMPTN is carried out before the SBMPTN.
- (2) SBMPTN implementation is carried out before or after prospective students graduated from secondary education.
- (3) Other selections are carried out after the result announcement of the SNMPTN and SBMPTN and must be completed no later than the end of July of the current year.

Article 5

Determination of the results of the students who pass the SNMPTN, SBMPTN, and other selection is the Rector's authority.

CHAPTER III

ACCOMMODATION IN NEW STUDENT ACCEPTANCE

Article 6

- (1) PTN determines and announces the number of new student capacity for:
  - a. SNMPTN;
  - b. SBMPTN; and
  - c. other selection.
- (2) The capacity of SNMPTN students as referred to paragraph (1) letter a for each Study Program at PTN is set at least 20% (twenty percent).
- (3) The capacity for SBMPTN students as referred to paragraph (1) letter b for each Study Program at a PTN other than a legal entity PTN is set at least 40% (forty percent).
- (4) The capacity of SBMPTN students as referred to in paragraph (1) letter b for each Study Program at a legal entity PTN is set at least 30% (thirty percent).

- (5) The capacity of other selected students as referred to in paragraph (1) letter c for each Study Program at a PTN other than a legal entity PTN is set at a maximum of 30% (thirty percent).
- (6) The capacity of other selected students as referred to in paragraph (1) letter c for PTN legal entities is set at a maximum of 50% (fifty percent) of the capacity of all Study Programs.

#### Article 7

- (1) The capacity of each Study Program as referred to in Article 6 is determined by the Rector's decision.
- (2) In the event that the SNMPTN Capacity as referred to Article 6 paragraph (2) is not met, the SNMPTN Capacity may be transferred to the SBMPTN.
- (3) In the event that the SBMPTN Capacity as referred to in Article 6 paragraph (3) is not met, the SBMPTN Capacity may be transferred to another selection.
- (4) The SBMPTN capacity that can be transferred to other selections as referred to in paragraph (3) is a maximum of 10% (ten percent).
- (5) Changes to the capacity as referred to in paragraphs (2) and (3) shall be stipulated by a Rector's Decree.

#### Article 8

PTN reports the Capacity, changes in Capacity, and the results of the selection of new student admissions for SNMPTN, SBMPTN, and other selections no later than 30 (thirty) days after the end of the new student registration to the Minister.

Article 9

- (1) PTNs are required to seek and recruit prospective students who have high academic potential, but are economically disadvantaged and prospective students from the leading, outermost, and lagging areas to be accepted at least 20% (twenty percent) of all new students accepted and spread across all study programs.
- (2) PTN in recruiting prospective students as referred to in paragraph (1) is carried out through SNMPTN, SBMPTN, and other selections.

CHAPTER IV  
IMPLEMENTING ORGANIZATIONS

Article 10

- (1) Implementation of new student admissions for SNMPTN and SBMPTN is carried out by higher education entrance test institutions.
- (2) The higher education entrance test institution as referred to in paragraph (1) is established by the Minister.
- (3) The higher education entrance test institution as referred to in paragraph (1) is a non-structural institution within the Ministry.
- (4) The higher education entrance test institute is under and responsible to the Minister.

Article 11

- (1) The higher education entrance test institution as referred to in Article 10 paragraph (1) has the task to organize tests for prospective students to enter higher education.
- (2) To carry out the tasks as referred to in paragraph (1), the higher education entrance test institution has the following functions:
  - a. planning and developing a higher education entrance test system;
  - b. develop and implement UTBK;

- c. coordinating data collection on the Capacity, changes, and realization of the new students capacity;
- d. manage and process data on prospective students from SNMPTN and SBMPTN;
- e. facilitate the admission of new students through SNMPTN and SBMPTN;
- f. conveying information on the results of the UTBK is confidential and only given to the participants concerned and the selected institution;
- g. conduct assessments and evaluations of the results of administering higher education entrance tests;
- h. perform quality assurance in the implementation of SNMPTN, UTBK, and SBMPTN;
- i. prepare reports on the administration of higher education entrance tests to the Minister; and
- j. carry out other duties from the Minister.

#### Article 12

Further provisions regarding the organization of higher education entrance test institutions shall be regulated by a Ministerial Regulation.

#### Article 13

Other selections organizations are regulated and determined by the Higher Education Executive in accordance with the provisions of the legislation.

CHAPTER V  
REQUIREMENTS FOR SELECTION PARTICIPANTS AND  
PROSPECTIVE STUDENTS

Article 14

- (1) SNMPTN participants meet the following requirements:
  - a. final year students in secondary education who will graduate in the current year;
  - b. have good and consistent academic achievement and/or portfolio;
  - c. enter the quota for the best rank in the school, determined based on the school's accreditation; and
  - d. meet other requirements determined by each PTN.
- (2) have good and consistent academic achievement and/or portfolio as referred to in paragraph (1) letter b and the best ranking quota in school as referred to in paragraph (1) letter c shall be conducted by a higher education entrance test institution.

Article 15

- SBMPTN participants meet the following requirements:
- a. has a valid UTBK score;
  - b. have a diploma or certificate of graduation from secondary education; and
  - c. graduated from secondary education in the last 3 (three) years.

Article 16

- (1) In addition to the requirements as referred to Article 15, PTN may consider prospective students who have superior achievements as other criteria in accordance with special talents determined by the relevant PTN on the SBMPTN.
- (2) Further provisions regarding the requirements, procedures and assessment of prospective new students who have superior achievements as other criteria in accordance with special talents determined by the relevant PTN as referred to paragraph (1) shall be regulated by the Rector

Article 17

Other selection participants meet the requirements set by the Rector.

Article 18

Requirements to be accepted as a new student of PTN consist of:

- a. participate in and be declared passed the selection of new student admissions;
- b. have had the original diploma in secondary education; and
- c. meet the requirements set by the PTN.

Article 19

Prospective students who have passed the selection and have registered are determined as new students through the Rector's Decree.

CHAPTER VI

FINANCING AND FINANCIAL ACCOUNTABILITY

Article 20

- (1) SNMPTN implementation financing is charged to the ministry's budget.
- (2) UTBK implementation financing is charged to the participants.
- (3) SBMPTN implementation financing is charged to the participants and ministry's budget.
- (4) other selection implementation financing is charged to the participants.

Article 21

Financial management and accountability for the implementation of the SNMPTN, SBMPTN and other selection in accordance with the provisions of laws and regulations.

CHAPTER VII  
OTHER PROVISIONS

Article 22

In the event that the UTBK cannot be carried out due to disability, nature, and infrastructure disturbances, the test can be carried out in writing on printed form and assistance.

CHAPTER VIII  
CLOSING PROVISIONS

Article 23

By the time this Ministerial Regulation came into force, The Minister of Research, Technology, and Higher Education Regulation No. 60 In 2018 concerning the Admission of New Bachelor Students in State Higher Education Institute (State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia Year 2018 Number 1732), revoked and declared invalid.

Article 24

This Ministerial Regulation shall come into force on the date of promulgation.

For public cognizance, order the promulgation of this Ministerial Regulation with its placement in the State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia.
